

Who can become a Foreign Service Officer?

The Department of State requires that all applicants be:

- A U.S. citizen on the date you submit your registration package
- At least 20 years old and no older than 59 years of age on the day you submit your registration
- At least 21 years old and not yet 60 on the day you are appointed as a Foreign Service Officer
- Available for worldwide assignment, including Washington, D.C.

You are not required to know a foreign language to become a FSO but proficiency in one or more languages will enhance your competitiveness.
