

Section B: Statement of Work

Repair 1st Floor Bathroom for Consulate Office Building in Fukuoka

1. Scope of Work

The Contractor shall repair walls, ceilings, doors and plumbing fixtures in 1st floor bathrooms of Consulate Office Building in Fukuoka, located at 2-5-26 O-hori, Chuo-ku, Fukuoka-shi, Fukuoka 810-0052, Japan.

2. General

2.1 All work required under this contract shall be accomplished in accordance with Japan Architectural Specification Standard (JASS). All work required under this contract shall be performed in a professional manner of the respective trade. The Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) and/or COR's designee shall perform QA/QC inspection on contracted work at-any-time basis. Any found deficiencies and/or discrepancies against contract work requirement and specifications shall be corrected accordingly by the Contractor at no additional cost to the Consulate.

2.2 All materials and labor shall be furnished by the Contractor unless otherwise stipulated herein. Quality of all materials to be used for all required work shall meet or exceed Japan Industrial Standard (JIS).

2.3 The Contractor shall be responsible for keeping the work areas clean and neat. After completion of work, the Contractor shall clean the work areas and leave it in a vacuum-clean condition. The Contractor shall dispose of all debris left over from the contracted work outside the Housing Compound in accordance with applicable local codes for industrial waste disposal, unless otherwise stipulated herein.

2.4 Prior to work commencement on the job site, the Contractor shall submit to the COR for approval material samples, shop drawings, color samples, and a work schedule as requested.

2.5 The Contractor shall guarantee all the work completed and any materials supplied by the Contractor under this contract one (1) year from the date of acceptance against any defects.

2.6 It is the Contractor's responsibility to verify all dimensions and any site conditions. The Contractor shall notify the COR of any discrepancies or inconsistencies between the plans and the site conditions before work occurs and alters the existing conditions.

2.7 It is the Contractor's responsibility to notify the COR of any discrepancies between the plans and the specifications or any requirements identified in the contract prior to the commencement of work. If any such discrepancies are identified after the commencement of work, the COR will decide which detail or statement is most beneficial to the USG and that detail or statement will be implemented by the Contractor at the Contractor's expense.

3. Bathroom repair work

3.1 Removal work: Remove and dispose of existing floor tiles, wall tiles, ceilings, toilet partitions, commode, mirror, and lighting fixtures. Carefully remove the basins and donate to TOTO museum in Kyushu. Contractor shall provide a portable fan with flexible duct. Make barriers with temporary studs and plastic sheets for dust control.

3.2 Plumbing: Replace sewer and waste water pipe horizontally running in the Basement ceiling spaces. Use PVC pipe materials to match with existing pipe size. Restore the ceilings if some sections are required to cut and remove.

3.3 Remove and dispose of bathroom entrance doors. Cut wall around the door opening to install new W900mm hinged doors.

3.4 Construct 150mm thickness of H1100mm walls at the back of commodes, urinal, and basins for plumbing spaces if necessary. Finish the tops with CORIAN acrylic marble counters.

3.5 New wall under H1100mm: Furnish W900mm 12mm thickness panels with wood grain AICA melamine film finish and install the panel with W12mm stainless strip joints. The same stainless border shall be installed at the top horizontally. Install H70mm stainless steel baseboards. Stainless steel baseboard shall be recessed from the melamine finish.

3.6 New wall above H1100mm to ceiling: Furnish 200X200mm ceramic wall tiles RIPPLE FDKC-200 from LIXIL. Submit the samples to select the color.

3.7 New floor tiles: Furnish 600X600mm ceramic floor tiles CRONO STONE KING POLICE CIM -600 from LIXIL. Submit the samples to select the color.

3.8 Basin: Furnish W1600mm premade counter with 2 sets of basins "OFFICE" model from TOTO. Furnish 2 sets of auto flow faucets TENA 12A, drain hardware T7W41, soap dispensers TS127AMN, Brackets M9P40A, and Mirrors with LED lights EL80017.

3.9 New Ceilings: Install new ceiling gypsum board on the existing height. Leave W300mm spaces along the ceiling perimeters and install indirect LED lights.

Install 4 sets of LED down lights in each bathroom. Install one set of 500X500mm access hatch in each bathroom. Apply fiber mesh joint tapes and plaster putty and make a flat smooth ceiling surface. Apply minimum 2 coats of water base emulsion paint.

3.10 Toilet booths: Create one set of W2385XD1800mm toilet booth for men, one set of W2385XD1800mm and W1300XD830mm for women. Furnish partitions MELAMINE POST FORM BOOTH from AICA. W2385XD1800mm booth requires a W900mm sliding door. All partitions continue from floor to ceiling, but use melamine finish from floor to H2100mm and continue with frosty glass from H2100mm to the ceiling for W2385mm partitions for penetration of natural light. Furnish W900mm single partition for Urinal with the same product.

3.11 New Commodes: Furnish a total of 3 set of new commodes CES957M#NW1 with battery remote control type. Furnish 1 set of urinal UFS900J from TOTO in men's bathroom.

3.12 Hardware: The Contractor shall furnish the following TOTO hardware:

- 4 sets of Hook, YKH52WAR
- 3 sets of Toilet paper holder, YH701
- 3 sets of File holder, YKH53A
- 3 sets of racks, YKH51A
- 3 sets of L shaped Grab rail, YHR86ML
- 2 sets of Sanitary box, YKB101
- 2 sets of paper towel holder, YKT300MN and YR4W
- 2 sets of dust box, UTR420
- 3 sets of seat paper holders, YR30 and YR3F

3.13 Furnish 2 sets of W1000XH1800mm mirrors and install opposite walls from basins.

3.14 Replace wood casing for exterior window and finish with stain and varnish.

Section D: Inspection and Acceptance

D.1 The Contracting Officer's Representative (COR), or his/her authorized representatives, will inspect from time to time the services being performed and the supplies furnished to determine whether work is being performed in a satisfactory manner, and that all supplies are of acceptable quality and standards.

The Contractor shall be responsible for any countermeasures or corrective action, within the scope of this contract, which may be required by the Contracting Officer as a result of such inspection.

D.2 Substantial Completion

(a) "Substantial Completion" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined and certified by the Contracting Officer in writing to the Contractor, on which the work (or a portion designated by the Government) is sufficiently complete and satisfactory. Substantial completion means that the property may be occupied or used for the purpose for which it is intended, and only minor items such as touch-up, adjustments, and minor replacements or installations remain to be completed or corrected which:

- (1) do not interfere with the intended occupancy or utilization of the work, and
- (2) can be completed or corrected within the time period required for final completion.

(b) The "date of substantial completion" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer or authorized Government representative as of which substantial completion of the work has been achieved.

Use and Possession upon Substantial Completion - The Government shall have the right to take possession of and use the work upon substantial completion. Upon notice by the Contractor that the work is substantially complete (a Request for Substantial Completion) and an inspection by the Contracting Officer or an authorized Government representative (including any required tests), the Contracting Officer shall furnish the Contractor a Certificate of Substantial Completion. The certificate will be accompanied by a Schedule of Defects listing items of work remaining to be performed, completed or corrected before final completion and acceptance. Failure of the Contracting Officer to list any item of work shall not relieve the Contractor of responsibility for complying with the terms of the contract. The Government's possession or use upon substantial completion shall not be deemed an acceptance of any work under the contract.

D.3 Final Completion and Acceptance

D.3.1 "Final completion and acceptance" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined by the Contracting Officer and confirmed in writing to the Contractor, at which all work required under the contract has been completed in a satisfactory manner, subject to the discovery of defects after final completion, and except for items specifically excluded in the notice of final acceptance.

D.3.2 The "date of final completion and acceptance" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer when final completion of the work has been achieved, as indicated by written notice to the Contractor.

D.3.3 Final Inspection and Tests - The Contractor shall give the Contracting Officer at least five days advance written notice of the date when the work will be fully completed and ready for final inspection and tests. Final inspection and tests will be started not later than the date specified in the notice unless the Contracting Officer determines that the work is not ready for final inspection and so informs the Contractor.

D.3.4 Final Acceptance - If the Contracting Officer is satisfied that the work under the contract is complete (with the exception of continuing obligations), the Contracting Officer shall issue to the Contractor a notice of final acceptance and make final payment upon:

- a) Satisfactory completion of all required tests,
- b) A final inspection that all items by the Contracting Officer listed in the Schedule of Defects have been completed or corrected and that the work is finally complete (subject to the discovery of defects after final completion), and
- c) Submittal by the Contractor of all documents and other items required upon completion of the work, including a final request for payment (Request for Final Acceptance).

Section E: Deliveries or Performance

E.1 FAR 52.211-10 Commencement, Prosecution, and Completion of Work (APR 1984)

The Contractor shall be required to:

- (a) commence work under this contract on the date specified in the notice to proceed,
- (b) prosecute the work diligently, and,
- (c) complete the entire work ready for use not later than 30 days after commencement of work.

The time stated for completion shall include final cleanup of the premises and completion of punch list items.

E.2 FAR 52.211-12 Liquidated Damages - Construction (SEP 2000)

- (a) If the Contractor fails to complete the work within the time specified in the contract, or any extension, the Contractor shall pay liquidated damages to the U.S. Government in the amount of \$10,000 for each calendar day of delay until the work is completed or accepted.
- (b) If the Government terminates the Contractor's right to proceed, liquidated damages will continue to accrue until the work is completed. These liquidated damages are in addition to excess costs of repurchase under the Default clause.

E.3 Contractor's Submission of Construction Schedules

- (a) The time for submission of the schedules referenced in FAR 52.236-15, "Schedules for Construction Contracts", paragraph (a), is hereby modified to reflect the due date for submission as 10 calendar days after receipt of an executed contract".
- (b) These schedules shall include the time by which shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals required by the contract will be submitted for approval.
- (c) The Contractor shall revise such schedules (1) to account for the actual progress of the work, (2) to reflect approved adjustments in the performance schedule, and (3) as required by the Contracting Officer to achieve coordination with work by the Government and any separate contractors used by the Government. The Contractor shall submit a schedule, which sequences work so as to minimize disruption at the job site.

(d) All deliverables shall be in the English language and any system of dimensions (English or metric) shown shall be consistent with that used in the contract. No extension of time shall be allowed due to delay by the Government in approving such deliverables if the Contractor has failed to act promptly and responsively in submitting its deliverables. The Contractor shall identify each deliverable as required by the contract.

(e) Acceptance of Schedule. When the Government has accepted any time schedule; it shall be binding upon the Contractor. The completion date is fixed and may be extended only by a written contract modification signed by the Contracting Officer. Acceptance or approval of any schedule or revision thereof by the Government shall not:

- (1) Extend the completion date or obligate the Government to do so,
- (2) Constitute acceptance or approval of any delay, or
- (3) Excuse the Contractor from or relieve the Contractor of its obligation to maintain the progress of the work and achieve final completion by the established completion date.

E.4 Notice of Delay

If the Contractor receives a notice of any change in the work, or if any other conditions arise which are likely to cause or are actually causing delays which the Contractor believes may result in late completion of the project, the Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer. The Contractor's notice shall state the effect, if any, of such change or other conditions upon the approved schedule, and shall state in what respects, if any, the relevant schedule or the completion date should be revised. The Contractor shall give such notice promptly, not more than ten (10) days after the first event giving rise to the delay or prospective delay. Only the Contracting Officer may make revisions to the approved time schedule.

E.5 Notice to Proceed

(a) After receiving and accepting any bonds or evidence of insurance, the Contracting Officer will provide the Contractor a Notice to Proceed. The Contractor must then prosecute the work, commencing and completing performance not later than the time period established in the contract.

(b) It is possible that the Contracting Officer may elect to issue the Notice to Proceed before receipt and acceptance of any bonds or evidence of insurance. Issuance of a Notice to Proceed by the Government before receipt of the required bonds or insurance

certificates or policies shall not be a waiver of the requirement to furnish these documents.

E.6 Working Hours

All work shall be performed during the hours between 09:00 and 17:00, Monday through Sunday including Holidays. Other hours, if requested by the Contractor, may be approved by the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). The Contractor shall give 24 hours in advance to COR who will consider any deviation from the hours identified above. Changes in work hours, initiated by the Contractor, will not be a cause for a price increase.

E.7 Preconstruction Conference

A preconstruction conference will be held 10 days after contract award at the Management Office of the U.S. Consulate Fukuoka to discuss the schedule, submittals, notice to proceed, mobilization and other important issues that effect construction progress. See FAR 52.236-26, Preconstruction Conference.

Section F: Administrative Data

F.1 DOSAR 652.242-70 Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) (AUG 1999)

(a) The Contracting Officer may designate in writing one or more Government employees, by name or position title, to take action for the Contracting Officer under this contract. Each designee shall be identified as a Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). Such designation(s) shall specify the scope and limitations of the authority so delegated; provided, that the designee shall not change the terms or conditions of the contract, unless the COR is a warranted Contracting Officer and this authority is delegated in the designation.

(b) The COR for this contract is Kazuhiko Araki - Maintenance Foreman/Inspector at the U.S. Consulate Fukuoka.

F.2 Payment

The Contractor's attention is directed to Section H, 52.232-5, "Payments Under Fixed-Price Construction Contracts." The following elaborates on the information contained in that clause:

Requests for payment, may be made no more frequently than monthly. Payment requests shall cover the value of labor and materials completed and in place, including a prorated portion of overhead and profit.

After receipt of the Contractor's request for payment, and on the basis of an inspection of the work, the Contracting Officer shall make a determination as to the amount, which is then due. If the Contracting Officer does not approve payment of the full amount applied for, less the retainage allowed by in 52.232-5, the Contracting Officer shall advise the Contractor as to the reasons.

Under the authority of 52.232-27(a), the 14 day period identified in FAR 52.232-27(a)(1)(i)(A) is hereby changed to 30 days.

Section G: Special Requirements

G.1 Reserved

G.2 Insurance

The Contractor is required by FAR 52.228-5, "Insurance - Work on a Government Installation" to provide whatever insurance is legally necessary. The Contractor shall at its own expense provide and maintain during the entire performance period the following insurance amounts:

G.2.1 General Liability (includes premises/operations, collapse hazard, products, completed operations, contractual, independent contractors, broad form property damage, personal injury)

1. Bodily Injury on or off the site stated in Japanese Yen:

2. Property Damage on or off the site in Japanese Yen:

G.2.2 The foregoing types and amounts of insurance are the minimums required. The Contractor shall obtain any other types of insurance required by local law or that are ordinarily or customarily obtained in the location of the work. The limit of such insurance shall be as provided by law or sufficient to meet normal and customary claims.

G.2.3 The Contractor agrees that the Government shall not be responsible for personal injuries or for damages to any property of the Contractor, its officers, agents, servants, and employees, or any other person, arising from and incident to the Contractor's performance of this contract. The Contractor shall hold harmless and indemnify the Government from any and all claims arising therefrom, except in the instance of gross negligence on the part of the Government.

G.2.4 The Contractor shall obtain adequate insurance for damage to, or theft of, materials and equipment in insurance coverage for loose transit to the site or in storage on or off the site.

G.2.5 The general liability policy required of the Contractor shall name "the United States of America, acting by and through the Department of State", as an additional insured with respect to operations performed under this contract.

G.3 Document Descriptions

G.3.1 Supplemental Documents. The Contracting Officer shall furnish from time to time such detailed drawings and other information as is considered necessary, in the opinion of the Contracting Officer, to interpret, clarify, supplement, or correct inconsistencies, errors or omissions in the Contract documents, or to describe minor changes in the work not involving an increase in the contract price or extension of the contract time. The Contractor shall comply with the requirements of the supplemental documents, and unless prompt objection is made by the Contractor within 20 days, their issuance shall not provide for any claim for an increase in the Contract price or an extension of contract time.

G.3.1.1 Record Documents. The Contractor shall maintain at the project site:

- (1) a current marked set of Contract drawings and specifications indicating all interpretations and clarification, contract modifications, change orders, or any other departure from the contract requirements approved by the Contracting Officer; and,
- (2) a complete set of record shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals as approved by the Contracting Officer.

G.3.1.2 "As-Built" Documents. After final completion of the work, but before final acceptance thereof, the Contractor shall provide:

- (1) a complete set of "as-built" drawings, based upon the record set of drawings, marked to show the details of construction as actually accomplished; and,
- (2) record shop drawings and other submittals, in the number and form as required by the specifications.

G.4 Laws and Regulations

The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for complying with all laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the performance of the work, including those of the host country, and with the lawful orders of any governmental authority having jurisdiction. Host country authorities may not enter the construction site without the permission of the Contracting Officer. Unless otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer, the Contractor shall comply with the more stringent of the requirements of such laws, regulations and orders and of the contract. In the event of a conflict between the contract and such laws, regulations and orders, the Contractor shall promptly advise the Contracting Officer of the conflict and of the Contractor's proposed course of action for resolution by the

Contracting Officer.

G.4.1 The Contractor shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs and practices pertaining to labor, safety, and similar matters, to the extent that such compliance is not inconsistent with the requirements of this contract.

G.4.2 The Contractor shall give written assurance to the Contracting Officer that all subcontractors and others performing work on or for the project have obtained all requisite licenses and permits.

G.4.3 The Contractor shall submit proper documentation and evidence satisfactory to the Contracting Officer of compliance with this clause.

G.5 Construction Personnel

The Contractor shall maintain discipline at the site and at all times take all reasonable precautions to prevent any unlawful, riotous, or disorderly conduct by or among those employed at the site. The Contractor shall ensure the preservation of peace and protection of persons and property in the neighborhood of the project against such action. The Contracting Officer may require, in writing that the Contractor remove from the work any employee that the Contracting Officer deems incompetent, careless, insubordinate or otherwise objectionable, or whose continued employment on the project is deemed by the Contracting Officer to be contrary to the Government's interests.

G.5.1 If the Contractor has knowledge that any actual or potential labor dispute is delaying or threatens to delay the timely performance of this contract, the Contractor shall immediately give notice, including all relevant information, to the Contracting Officer.

G.5.2 After award of the contract, the Contractor has 10 calendar days to submit to the Contracting Officer a list of workers and supervisors assigned to this project for the Government to conduct all necessary security checks. It is anticipated that security checks will take 30 days to perform. Each individual shall complete and submit RSO Tokyo Security Form (see Attachment I-4).

Failure to provide any of the above information may be considered grounds for rejection and/or resubmittal of the application. Once the Government has completed the security screening and approved the applicants a badge will be provided to the individual for access to the site. This badge may be revoked at any time due to the falsification of data, or misconduct on site.

G.6 Materials and Equipment

All materials and equipment incorporated into the work shall be new and for the purpose intended, unless otherwise specified. All workmanship shall be of good quality and performed in a skillful manner that will withstand inspection by the Contracting Officer.

G.7 Special Warranties

G.7.1 Any special warranties that may be required under the contract shall be subject to the stipulations set forth in 52.246-21, "Warranty of Construction", as long as they are not in conflict.

G.7.2 The Contractor shall obtain and furnish to the Government all information required to make any subcontractor's, manufacturer's, or supplier's guarantee or warranty legally binding and effective. The Contractor shall submit both the information and the guarantee or warranty to the Government in sufficient time to permit the Government to meet any time limit specified in the guarantee or warranty, but not later than completion and acceptance of all work under this contract.

G.8 Equitable Adjustments

Any circumstance for which the contract provides an equitable adjustment that causes a change within the meaning of paragraph (a) of the "Changes" clause shall be treated as a change under that clause; provided, that the Contractor gives the Contracting Officer prompt written notice (within 20 days) stating:

- (a) the date, circumstances, and applicable contract clause authorizing an equitable adjustment and
- (b) that the Contractor regards the event as a changed condition for which an equitable adjustment is allowed under the contract.

The Contractor shall provide written notice of a differing site condition within 10 calendar days of occurrence following FAR 52.236-2, Differing Site Conditions.

G.9 Zoning Approvals and Permits

The U.S. Government shall be responsible for:

- (a) obtaining proper zoning or other land use control approval for the project;
- (b) obtaining the approval of the Contracting Drawings and Specifications;
- (c) paying fees due for the foregoing; and
- (d) obtaining and paying for the initial building permits.
